Drawing on historical evidence analyzed in his book Dealing with Dictators, the relationship between the United States and Hungary during the Second World War and the Cold War, Laszlo Borhi will discuss some relevant issues of international relations. Finally, through the lessons of the regime change of 1989/1990, Borhi will discuss whether domestic transformation can generate systemic change in international politics.
